Participants must be 55 years or older. The league has 11 teams of 4 men and women bowling each week, and enjoying every minute of it. Instruction was made available to those senior citizens wishing it.

Special Thanks to Ray for his efforts in organizing this league - providing 44 senior citizens with an opportunity they might otherwise not have had.
