1968 OFFICERS - DIRECTORS TO BE INSTALLED JANUARY 3

DIVISION BANQUET HELD LAST WEDNESDAY

Kiwanians and Kweens from Iowa City, Marion, Washington, Vinton, Cedar Rapids Metro, and our own club participated last Wednesday evening in the installation ceremonies for 1968 Lt. Governor Jim Corell.

Don LaVelle, Governor for 1968 of the Nebraska-Iowa District, expanded upon the theme for his year in office: BE A BUILDER - BECOME PERSONALLY INVOLVED.

Following his address, he presented Jim Corell with the Lt. Governor's pin for Division II, and elevated Marion's L.B. DeWees to the capacity of Past Lt. Governor. DeWees presented President-elect Warren Kintzinger with the Division II Lt. Governor's banner, which will be displayed each week at our meetings during 1968.

Special recognition was given to past Lt. Governors attending: J.W. Ensign, Harry Robson, C.H. McClure; and to Past Governor Don Isett - who also was recognized for the fine job as chairman for the banquet arrangements.

President Frank Cosgrove did his usual splendid job as toastmaster for the evening - and the meeting was adjourned at 8:45 p.m.

BUSLOAD HEADS FOR ELDORA JANUARY 5

Lt. Governor Jim Corell has announced that a chartered bus will furnish transportation for Kiwanians and Kweens to attend the Inaugural Banquet in Eldora next Friday evening for Governor Don LaVelle. The fare is \$5.00 per person.

The bus will start in Iowa City, and will pick up Cedar Rapids area Kiwanians about 4:15 p.m. at Mays City west where members may leave their cars.

Reservations should be made with Corell by next Wednesday noon, Jan. 3. About 500 persons from Division II are expected to attend the event.

Lt. Governor Jim Corell will kick off our new year and his tour of installations for Division II clubs next Wed. noon, January 3rd, as he officiates at the installation of our 1968 officers.

All officers, directors and chairmen for the past year of 1967 and the new year are asked to be present.
