## LAST WEEK

Mark McCauley, KIWANIS' sponsored member of the Experiment in International Living and Regis High School Senior, discussed the highlights of his visit to England this past summer. The Cedar Rapids area was well represented this year with some 34 young people in the program. High school juniors are selected to assure that they are around one more academic year to help bring the story of their experiences to their fellow students and the community.

Mark's experience was somewhat unusual in that he spent time with three different English families. He can't decide whether that was fortunate or unfortunate, but obviously he enjoyed every minute of it and got a look inside three entirely different life styles. The first family he joined was what Mark considers to be middle-class. The male head of the family is an electrician with Proctor and Gamble. There were three children, two boys and a girl. They live in the northern part of England near the ocean. Like many a land-locked midwesterner, Mark was fascinated by the sea and felt completely at home with his English "family." They helped him to see England and the English, not as a bloomin' tourist, but through the eyes of the natives.

Mark's second English family was the gentleman farmer/Rolls Royce-in-the-garage-type. His final weeks in England were spent with a young couple who had been married only a couple of months. Their apartment was small but Mark's comments left me with a feeling that he thoroughly enjoyed the opportunity to do the eating places and pubs with them, and the opportunity to get acquainted with and better understand the young English man and woman.

Mark McCauley left Cedar Rapids by bus in June of this year, spent several days on the U.S. east coast being briefed on the activities to follow, and then, in company with EIL representatives from various parts of the country, flew to Brussels. The next stop for Mark was London for a week of touring.

Apparently Mark can't decide whether he gained more from his stay in England--or the opportunity he had to meet and get acquainted with Americans from other parts of the country. Obviously he sincerely appreciated the opportunity he had to participate in EIL. And I doubt if we could have had a better Ambassador!
