Bob Dye quotes the philosophy of the organization--"Youth for Christ believes the social, physical and mental areas must all function as a cohesive whole, with the original dimension as the fulcrum."

Mr. Hill met with members of Downtown KIWANIS Youth Services, Committee Group #8 on October 27 to discuss the program. Committee Chairman Charles McIntyre carried the story and request to last Tuesday's board meeting where a motion was passed to support VICA with a \$100 loan, to be paid back within the year. It has been suggested that such a procedure might be followed to help other youth organizations get underway. Albert Gee is planning an aggressive campaign to organize KIWANIS Key and Circle K Clubs in the Cedar Rapids/Iowa City area.
