Should be an interesting discussion and a good program for special guests.

## LAST WEEK

Another VIP - Alan Swegle - Farm Editor of the Cedar Rapids Gazette - in a particularly appropriate appearance for Farm-City Week and Thanksgiving. Was either given a flying start - or upstaged - by an inimitable Doc Fenner introduction. Doc as self-designated vice-president and chairman in charge of introductions for the program - sponsoring Agricultural Committee undertook to turn over his personal cheering section to the guest speaker as a means of keeping the club awake and aroused.

In spite of the introduction and an opening foot-in-snow jest (absent members who are gluttons for punishment can obtain details from friends in attendance) Mr. Swegle gave his audience a most interesting presentation touching on Iowa farm personalities ranging from Nobel Prize winner Dr. Borlaug to Dairy Princesses ... indicating our own club's corn-rooted background by showing that about half those present came from farms and most of the rest had married farmers' daughters. Also explained how our record corn crop happened (a calculated corn blight damage didn't materialize) and the possible long and short term results. Suggested the somewhat puzzling Earl Butz nomination might have been a "lightning-rod" ploy - the administration hoping an outspoken and perhaps controversial figure might drain off some static otherwise striking the White House directly.

A provocative series of follow-up questions spear-headed by Robert Armstrong worked into an interesting circle. Re over-production, export better than controls; saves tax money ... how do you sell to customers without money or credit ... that's the problem - better limit production. Ron Moore against tax-payer subsidization of farm business unless they also subsidize insurance agencies. Answer - no answer; but unless we keep the family farmer in existence, big business may take over and eventually taxpayers will have higher food costs.
