LAST WEEK

Bob Majors, Director of Development, Cornell College, told us the small liberal arts colleges are pricing themselves out of the market. He lists a number of factors which have put them in their present predicament, but in general--as in the case of most predicaments--it boils down to poor management.

Bob Majors is a graduate of Cornell. His home was Omaha. Following graduation from college, he taught and coached wrestling on the West Coast and then returned to Iowa and sold life insurance in Cedar Rapids for a number of years. He joined the staff at Cornell in 1966.

Majors feels that some of the small colleges will survive, as they did during the depression of the 1930's, but "it won't be easy." But we all have a stake in their survival. 41% of the college students are currently enrolled in private colleges! Like many businesses, the college administrators liked to think that the lush days of the 50's and early 60's would never end. The staffs grew fat; the teaching load grew light; the services grew out of proportion to actual need; salaries out of proportion to service rendered; you know the story, it all has a familiar ring!

Was glad to hear Bob Majors say that he has noted a marked change in the attitude of the students in the past year or two. They are a more mature, serious, concerned group than they were during the late 60's, when every campus had its riots and sit-ins. He feels the extremists have over-played their hands. They have lost their audience. Today's students aren't as liable to accept everything at face value as many of us oldsters did when we were their age. The old statement "There's no reason. It's policy!" isn't acceptable to them.

All in all, Bob Majors didn't paint a very rosey picture of the financial status of the institutions of higher learning, but he gave us further insight into a problem which most of us recognized existed. Now all we need is the where-with-all to solve the problem.
