LAST WEEK

"Game Warden" Orlan Handelman gave us a look at conservation and game management from the professional's point of view. Did you know that these hunters served a useful purpose in the game management picture? Will have to admit that in recent years I have been agin' the hunter, and "open seasons" in general.

Handelman relates the experience with quail in Iowa. It was the general feeling a few years ago by everyone that quail were on the way out and soon would become an extinct specie. There were very few birds and those that were around were "skinny and scrawny." Handelman says even the "pros" in game management were resigned to the fact that quail were going the way of the dodo bird. But for some reason (and I missed that), the game management people decided that there should be an open season on quail. (Probably to speed up their demise!) What happened? The number of quail increased and they became the fat little balls of feathers that they are today.

Orlan feels the explanation is that the few coveys that were left were scattered by the hunters into smaller coveys, or possibly pairs, and they enjoyed the arrangement so much that they propagated, or whatever quail do. There are now relatively large number of quail scattered throughout the state. The same general plan has been followed with deer. Hunters break up the large herds into small herds and the biological process does the rest! Did you realize that some 70/80 deer were killed by automobiles each year in Linn County.

Conservation Officer Handelman indicates that approximately 30% of the conservation officer's time is spent in law enforcement; 40% in public relations; and the balance in such activities as game surveys. He says it is a 24-hour a day job--in spite of what some of the taxpayers think! But obviously he enjoys it, and isn't complaining.
