### LAST WEEK

Downtown KIWANIAN Eugene Adney would like to see the Salvation Army put out of business! Sounds a bit strange coming from the Major, doesn't it? But it really isn't such an unusual statement when he explains----as he did last Wednesday----that most of the recipients of help from the Salvation Army are those who cannot seem to find a slot in society as presently constituted. If there weren't so many "who do not fit in", Gene and fellow Army staff members would be hard put to keep busy. (Appears you won't have to be worried about being unemployed, Gene. Looks like a bumper crop of problems in the making in this permissive society of ours!)

Eugene Adney has been in the Salvation Army for 20 years. He grew up in Beloit, Wisconsin and took his ministerial training in the Salvation Army school in Chicago. Gene is currently responsible for the Cedar Rapids Salvation Army's church and youth and social programs. Downtown KIWANIAN John Kimmons operates the self-supporting business known as the Men's Social Service Center and Red Shield stores.

The Salvation Army was started in 1865 by William Booth, who left the Methodist ministry to preach in the slums of London. The Reverend Booth set up Christian Mission Centers. In 1878, Booth adopted the name Salvation Army. There are three types of members: Commissioned Officers who are ordained ministers devoting their lives to the Army's work; Soldiers who are members of the congregation and comprise the local Corps; Adherents, persons of good standing and character who consider the Salvation Army their place of worship. Today the Salvation Army serves 71 countries, preaches in 146 languages, and maintains 19,599 religious/charitable centers.

Funding for capital expenditures such as the Social Service Center and more recently, the purchase of the old Fillmore School property, is by legacy---money willed to the Salvation Army for that purpose. Funds to carry on the day-to-day activities of the Army come primarily from UCS. There is much more! Ask Major Adney or Major Kimmons!
