## LAST WEEK

1970---26 aircraft hi-jackings; 1971---22 hi-jackings; thus far 1972---32 hi-jackings! And if you know how to stop them, or even reduce the number, give any FBI Office a call. Bill Williams, Special Assistant to the Agent-in-Charge of the Omaha FBI Office told us last Wednesday Noon that there doesn't appear to be a solution to the problem. He said the airlines now seem to fully recognize that the problem isn't going to go away. Passenger and baggage scrutiny of boarding passengers is being given top priority, but as was pointed out, not all hi-jackers get aboard via the loading ramp. At least two have boarded planes while the aircraft were far from the ramps being readied for service with just the crew aboard. The FBI has authority while the plane is setting still on the field. When airborne or taking off or landing, the FAA is responsible. With 150 million air passengers per year, it is no small task and responsibility. Airplane hi-jackings and hostage/kidnap robberies of banks are the two categories of crime which are currently being given priority attention by the FBI, according to Williams. Bill Williams grew up in North Carolina; spent some time as a Marine; graduated from college and joined the FBI in 1952. Assignments prior to the current one at Omaha, included Albany, N.Y.; Newark, N.J.; Tampa, Florida and Washington, D. C.
