## THIS WEEK-----September 13, 1972

Roosevelt Hotel---Brigadier Josef Korbel, Salvation Army--Evangelism Department, Chicago District, will speak to us on Wednesday. Brig. Korbel was born in Czechoslovakia in 1907. He was trained as a textile designer and was indifferent to religion until he heard the Salvation Army on the streets of Prague. Korbel became interested in the Salvation Army and their works, joined the organization and was later accepted into the Salvation Army Officer Training Program. He married a Salvation Army Officer and spent some 20 years in Czechoslovakia helping mankind thru the Army program. When politics changed and Czechoslovakia was overrun, Josef Korbel was imprisoned. He spent ten years behind the bars and wasn't released until 1959. During this period of imprisonment, Mrs. Korbel worked as a nurse to support the family of three children. In 1968 Korbel was permitted to leave Prague and moved to Switzerland where he spent 2½ years before coming to the United States. His experiences behind the Iron Curtain were as "unreal" as the events of the past week in Munich.
